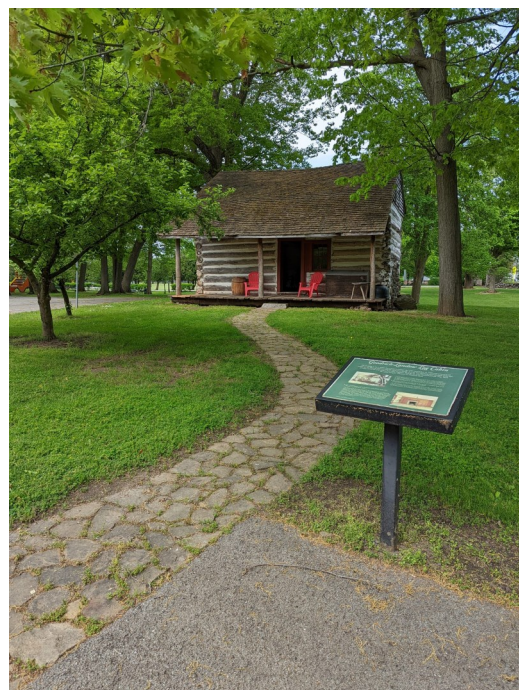

Did You Know Joan Baez Lived In Clarence Center?



Long before her music career began, Joan Baez and her family lived in Clarence Center at 6095 Railroad Street (below). In 1949, her father took a position with the University of Buffalo, and Joan spent two years having all the typical experiences of a child growing up in the Four Corners, playing in the snow, walking to Clarence Center Elementary, and attending the Labor Day fair. When her family moved to Boston, she began performing in coffeehouses and recorded her first album in 1960. In November 2011, Joan Baez (left) visited her old Clarence homestead and saw some old friends. She fondly recalled how she and the neighborhood girls would sneak out at night, climb the trees across the street, and proceed to watch the only television in town.
